Use the sample card below. Ask your pupils to use either Template 1 or Template 2 to write a card thanking someone in their community for taking care of it.

Step 3: Check your Work

Pupil's should be encouraged to check their work.

Teacher Guide

Caring for Our Community



We hope you're excited to participate in An Post's annual Writing Competition. We've put together a Teacher's Guide to help you facilitate card writing in your class.

1. Introduction

Show the slides to the pupils and ask prompting questions. The pupils can engage in think-pairshare and may need some prompting in places.

- What does 'community' mean?
- What communities are you a part of? (Think about your town, your clubs, places you like to visit)
- What do you like about your communities?
- How do you protect or look after your community?
- Who helps to look after your community?
- How does it make you feel to be part of a community?
- Why is it important to be in a community?
 - How are the people in these images caring for their community?

Remind pupils it is important to build community around us, like the post worker is doing when he delivers letters.

- Explain some of the key vocabulary to the pupils.
 - Care: "offering kindness, attention, and responsibility to nurture the well-being, safety, and happiness of others or things in need."
 - **Nurture:** "giving love, care, and attention to help things, people or communities grow and be happy".
 - **Community:** "a group of people living in a particular area or who have common interests such as the sport they play".
 - **Sustainable:** "taking care of planet Earth so it stays healthy for a long, long time".
 - **Reduce, Reuse, Recycle:** "ways to be kinder to planet Earth and to make less waste".
 - Biodiversity: "the different plants and animals living in nature".

- Diversity (Being the same, and different): "having friends who are different in cool ways".
- **Inclusion (Including others):** "making sure everyone has a chance to join in and play together".
- **Discuss** (as a whole class, in groups or pairs) the pictures that the pupils see on the slides that follow. Encourage discussion on the images, use them as a stimulus and to gauge pupils' understanding of the topics. Elicit and question as necessary to help deepen their understanding and appreciation of the importance of nurturing inclusive and caring communities.
- Role Play Local Helpers: Split class into small groups and assign each group a role as a community helper (e.g., post worker, doctor, firefighter). Groups perform a short role-play about how they care for the community while the rest of the class guesses who they are and how they help.

Reading and Writing

- Read the sample letter to the pupils. If possible, display it to them.
- Ask pupils to write a card to thank someone in their community for helping to care for it.
- Ask pupils to use one of the templates provided.

3. Entry Submission

- Write the final version of the card in the template provided. A copy could be made of the card and retained for the pupils to display in an area in the classroom or shared with parents.
- Complete the entry form and send entries to the address on page 1 of this document.










